Terry Hyde remaked that we need to advertise the stamp more in the future Next meeting there will be more on the artists proofs for next years stamp print project. Ron has in his possession the 125 Artists proofs it was agreed that 12 go to the artist and 12 got to Sportsmans Specialitits. These proofs are for fundralsing and give aways and NOT for sale. Motion made by Ron Sandrus to give tow artists proofs to each local chapter with the stipulation that they are not to be sold. "nd Fred L. Webster. APPROVED Finance Comm. A report was passed out for all to review. 1st half payment has been made and our half due to national has been made and acknowledged by National. Sles of stamps only 235. Terry would .like to see that the expenses that have been drawn from the General Fund to implement the program be reimbersed back to the general fund. MOTION made by Jack Crouse. A letter from National was read that suggested that funds derived from our Stamp Print program by chaneled to fund part of Frank Rice's strip mine research \$1.500 per month is needed to keep the project going. Carl Brown noted that a research foundation is being formulated by National that is to be governed by an outside board of directors this is being done so that States can designate funds to be used for research only.

MOTION made by Lee Lykens to desolve the Building fund. 2nd Tim Brady APPROVED MOTION made by Bob Meyer to follow the guide lines that the finance committee recommends for appropriating the money of funds raised by the stamp print program. 2 nd Doug Done APPROVED

Nominations head directos should check with all directors in their region to see if they wish to continue. Confirmation is needed by January 1, 1982. Then he will send a letter to the State president and Lacal Chapter corrd. to work on the application to then be submitted to the state chapter for approval. Carl would like to see Shirley at the State Chapter presidents meeting along with the 1st vice president. Documtation was required to back the nomination all were contacted who had been nominated and asked to submit the supporting documntation. When the day arrived to send the info to nation the only complete file was sent in. Nation decided to cancle the award for this year and it will be given in 1983.
