Harvest Management

Preliminary 2011 spring turkey harvests were approximately 35,942 (33,897 initial harvests + 2,045 from the special turkey license; Table 1). The preliminary initial harvest is 22% below the 2010 preliminary initial harvest of 43,201, but only 3% below the previous 3-year average. This decrease most likely is due to the rainy weather throughout much of the season and below average summer reproduction two and three years ago in many WMUs, both of which decreased gobbling activity. The estimate also most likely is affected by recent changes in reporting rate due to on-line and phone reporting, but we will begin getting more consistent and reliable estimates when we initiate the annual spring hunter survey after the 2012 spring season. This preliminary initial harvest ranks as the second lowest during the past 10 years (2005 was the lowest at 32,594). 2011 ranked highest in sales of the special turkey licenses at 15,159, representing a 66% increase from the previous average sales (2006-2010). All-day spring hunting was initiated this year during the second half of the month-long season, and included two full weeks. Afternoon harvests comprised 5% of the total reported harvests, and 22% of harvests during the all-day portion of the season.

Wild Turkey Hen Harvest Rates and Annual Survival Rates Study

As part of the hen turkey harvest and survival rate study, we ordered equipment for the late summer turkey trapping season, coordinated with Regions and the PFWRC regarding transmitter recoveries and locations of transmittered hens and continued working with the transmitter manufacturer to redesign the transmitter harness attachments. During this reporting cycle we recovered 4 transmitters; 2 from each Study Area. The Study Area 2 (SA2) recoveries were from Tioga (mammalian predation) and Warren counties (transmitter fell off the hen due to equipment failure so the hen may still be alive). The recoveries from Study Area 1 (SA 1) were from Clearfield (equipment failure) and Indiana counties (coyote predation). This last recovery was of the hen that had made the longest movement, over 20 miles. She was one year old and had successfully nested as evidenced by poult feathers close to the recovered transmitter. Of the 119 total hens transmittered since January 2010, we have lost contact with 6 (battery failure, etc.), 10 transmitters fell off the hens due to equipment failure and one was censored (died within one week of capture). Of the remaining 102, 75 hens have died due to predation, harvest, illegal harvest or natural infection. Twenty-eight transmitters are active as of 22 July (14 of 61 in SA1; 14 of 58 in SA2).

Total reported leg-banded hen turkeys during the spring season are: 3 bearded hens harvest (2 in SA1, 1 in SA2), 2 road killed and 1 found killed by a predator while incubating a nest. Legband reports of male turkeys harvested are 51 (non-reward bands); 30 leg-banded between 2006–2009 during the gobbler harvest rate study and 21 legbanded between 2010-2011 during the hen harvest rate study. Ages of males banded





during the gobbler study were: one 6-year old (banded as a juvenile in 2006 and harvested in Centre Co); 3 5- year olds; 2 4-year olds; 10 at least 4 years old (banded as adult in 2009), 14 3-years old. During the all-day portion of the spring season we asked hunters if their harvest was before or after noon; only 2 of 19 were harvested after noon.

A turkey trapping/update workshop was held for all trappers to practice transmitter attachment, review aging/sexing methods for juveniles during late summer and winter trapping, provide group discussion to share tips for trapping/sexing birds, and discuss transmitter harness re-design.

We are preparing for the upcoming late summer trapping season (mid-August to early October) when we will leg band an additional 150 hens (75 per Study Area), focusing on brood flocks to obtain a sample of leg banded juvenile hens to estimate fall harvest rates by age. Transmitters recovered from mortalities will be re-deployed.

Annual Cooperative PGC/NWTF/PANWTF Meeting

This 37th annual meeting, held June 8 at the PGC headquarters, emphasizes the partnership between the PGC and NWTF/PANWTF and demonstrates the health and importance of this partnership. The PGC Executive Office and all pertinent PGC Bureaus participate. Twelve topics were discussed and 10 action items were identified for completion during the year.



PA Chapter NWTF Wild Turkey Management Committee Report July 30, 2011 PANWTF July Board Meeting Submitted by Don Heckman, WTM Committee

Wild Turkey Management changes requiring PGC Staff and Commissioner overview.

- 1) Support PGC Management Plan For Wild Turkeys In Pennsylvania, 2006-2015, goal, 8 objectives 47 strategies, with measurement timeline outlined, plans needs to be fully funded over the 10 years; several management plan strategies are not being fully funded or followed.
- 2) Northeast Wild Turkey Population Model implement in wild turkey management plan PA NWTF has \$15,000 invested in development; model data and modeling results are requirements for future wild turkey management decisions; Mary Jo updating model for implementation.
- 3) Recommendation for Mentored Youth Hunting to including fall turkey hunting season in regulation starting in 2011. PANWTF needs to continue to support "tag sharing" with Mentored Youth Hunters and then work with PGC to get their support for fall turkey hunting with fall antlerless hunting when the legislation is signed into law. **SB 274 legislation passed by House and Senate, signed by the Governor, regulated for 2011 antlered doe hunting season by PGC Commissioners.** Legislation gives PGC regulator authority for adding antlerless deer to Mentored Youth fall hunting seasons and bag limits. Fall wild turkey not included in legislation or regulation change.
- 4) Recommendation for Mentored Youth be included in fall turkey hunting season regulations starting when the WTMP criteria supports the regulation change. PANWTF supports "tag transferring"for Mentored Youth and Adult fall turkey hunter and will work with PGC to get their support for initiating this for fall turkey hunting. PANWTF needs to continue supporting "tag transferring" with Mentored Youth Hunter for Fall Turkey Hunting Season when talking to and communicating to PGC Executive Director and Commissioners. PANWTF will work with PGC to get their support to expand upon the tag transfer by including fall turkey hunting in the Mentored Youth program at a later date when and where WTMP criteria will allow additional fall harvest.
- 5) Recommendation to expand youth spring gobbler season and regular spring gobbler season to all day hunting after 4 year gobbler leg band research project is completed in 2009, project evaluation will be completed in 2010, and recommendations will be documented. At April 20, 2010 PGC Commissioner meeting they voted 8-0 to expand spring gobbler season for last two weeks of spring season up to May 31 to all day hunting starting Spring 2011. All day youth spring gobbler season will be reviewed for additional hunting opportunity.
- 6) Recommendation to expand youth spring gobbler to more than one day.
- 7) Continue recommendations to reduce or increase WMU fall season lengths as management plan setting fall season guidelines are determined; using management data based on current field data and indices, harvest densities, population densities, and hunter densities, as charted measurements outlined in the wild turkey management plan; when management data supports regulation change. Fall turkey hunting regulations for season start and end date changes were adopted by PGC BOC at April 20, 2010 Meeting. PANWTF and member articles have been distributed documenting our disapproval of these approved fall turkey hunting season regulations fro 2010. Feb. 1, 2011 under Proposed Rule making, Commissioner's move tentative fall turkey hunting season start date back to last Saturday of October. Saturday, October 29, 2011 will be first day of fall turkey hunting season, while WMU's will be back tp 1, 2, 3



weeks, plus 3 days for WMU 5A, or closed fall turkey hunting season in WMU 5B, 5C, 5D. Thanksgiving Day, Friday, and Saturday fall turkey hunting for 2011 is still in seasons and bag limits criteria as adopted by Commissioners. 2011, 4th Saturday, October 22 continues to be closed for fall turkey hunting and continues to be opening day Bear Season Start date. April 19th PGC Board of Commissioners adopted these season and bag limit dates under Final Rule Making for 2011.

- 8) PGC Gobbler Leg Band Research Study (2006-2009) has been completed. Study results have been documented by Dr. Duane Diefenbach and Mary Jo Casalena, and handed out to PA Chapter NWTF Board. What will be the PGC recommendations coming out of this research study and how will they be presented to PGC Executive Staff, Commissioner's, PA Chapter NWTF?
- 9) PGC submitted Fall Hen Harvest Rates Study to NWTF Technical Committee requesting funding for state-wide hen research/telemetry study for 4 years 2010-2013. Bob Boyd resubmitted and presented NWTF Grant-In-Aid proposal for 2011-2013. NWTF approved funding for 2011 trapping sessions. Mary Jo, Ian, or John Dunn and Bob Eriksen can update Board on final decision and payment schedule.
- 10) Wild Turkey Biologists Spring Options white paper has been finalized March 2010 for PGC Executive Staff and Commissioner's review. Number of Spring Options changes have been adopted under final rule making by Commissioner's like expanding spring gobbler season to all day hunting for last 2 weeks up to May 31 for spring season starting in 2011 No further reports back from Commissioner's or Executive Staff on other white paper suggestions or changes.
- 11) June 8, 2011, PGC Staff meeting with PA Chapter NWTF representatives in Harrisburg Headquarters building was held. Need to review action items and meeting minutes from June 2010 meeting for updates and changes.

Legislation changes that require Governor signature.

- 1) Spring Turkey Hunting License proposed by PA Chapter NWTF Board of Directors. Support statement and benefits talking points will need to be distributed to several key Legislator's, PGC Executive Staff, PGC Commissioner's, Local Chapter Presidents, NWTF Members, and turkey hunters if this moves forward.
- 2) PGC hunting license increase legislation Legislation has been submitted, SB 1046, in this legislative session, 2011-2012. Little opportunity for legislative approval at this time.
- 3) Support Sunday hunting as regulated by PGC, required legislation to change Title 34 Game Code. No Legislative vote was taken on Ibill in 2009-2010 legislative session. Legislative bill will be introduced in 2011-2012 legislative session.
- 4) Do not support legislation [Title 34 Game Code] through legislative wording that changes PGC hunting seasons, bag limits, and shooting hours. PGC hunting seasons, bag limits, and shooting hours are changed by Board of Commissioners through PGC Regulation [Title 58 Code].

Other Committee actions requiring PA Chapter NWTF Board participation and overview. PANWTF Spring Turkey Hunter Cooperative Program for Spring 2011 will be scheduled.

Other Committee actions requiring PGC Staff and Commissioner participation and overview.

1) Turkey hunting safety and ethics – New PGC Turkey Hunting Curriculum Course on schedule for Spring 2011 kick-off. Other PANWTF / PGC wild turkey hunter safety material - NWTF Turkey Hunter Safety DVD provided to PGC HTE classes; helping PGC reach out to 300,000+- turkey hunters with additional turkey hunter safety and ethics information and material; PA Edition NWTF Turkey Hunting Success and Safety brochure; NWTF Turkey Hunter Safety Task Force material; New updated PANWTF Turkey Hunting Safety posters.



2) Annually review of meeting minutes from PGC Executive Staff and PA NWTF June meeting as provided by PGC Wild Turkey Biologist Mary Jo Casalena. Final June 2011 minutes will be forwarded to PGC Staff and PANWTF Board. Important wild turkey management criteria and decision making changes have been accomplished since these joint partnership yearly meetings started back in the mid 1980's.
3) NWTF wild turkey management outreach programs - Wild Turkey Woodlands, Habitat Management, Turkey Hunting Safety Education, Land Acquisition, Conservation Seed programs, Project HELP, Operation Appleseed, Operation Oak, NWTF Grant opportunities for habitat improvement on Marcellus Shale well pads, other budgeted NWTF outreach programs and HHSF Super Fund expenditures, support funding for NWTF's Pennsylvania Comprehensive Wild Turkey Management Plan, continued distribution of PANWTF news releases, and articles in Turkey Talk, Tell The Story – Pass It On.

PA WITO Event Coordinators and Chapters -

Hope this email finds you all doing well and enjoying your summer! I appreciate all the work that you and your committee have continued to do to make NWTF's Women in the Outdoors program strong in PA!

As you may already know, we have a contract with the Pennsylvania Game Commission that will extend through June 2012. As part of this contractual agreement, WITO participant records are to be kept through the PA Game Commission's Event Manager online registration system. Reporting of participants in this manner allows the PGC to determine if participating in WITO has an effect on hunting/trapping license sales in the female population - for example, are the majority of WITO participants already license buyers prior to participating in the event, or is the contrary true? Do women tend to buy licenses after participating in a WITO event, perhaps because of the interest they gained during their WITO experience? This is a great opportunity for our program!

We made the process of finding the PGC's PA WITO Event Manager Calendar much easier by providing a link directly to the calendar on our website www.womenintheoutdoors.orghttp://www.womenintheoutdoors.org<, in addition to its home already through the PGC's webpage. Women interested in looking for a PA WITO event to participate in simply need to go to the PA WITO Event Manager Calendar and type in their zip code and the distance they are willing to travel to an event, and all pertinent scheduled events will come up for their choosing.

Once a participant chooses an event to register for, they are taken to a registration page where they are able to download the event's individual flyer/registration form; here they are also instructed to not only register on-line, but also to download and complete the event's flyer/registration form and mail, along with payment, to the event coordinator.

The PA WITO Event Manager also has multiple benefits for event coordinators if they would like to be an administrator of their event (this is optional). Event coordinators are able to go in to their event on Event Manager and manage registrant data, such as downloading a real-time list of those registered for the event. One such use for this



would be to cross-reference this list with those who have mailed their registration form and payment - for example, if the event coordinator notices that a few participants registered on-line, but have not yet mailed in their registration form and payment, the event coordinator can then contact those individuals and remind them to do so. On the flip side, if a participant only registers through the paper registration form sent directly to the event coordinator, the event coordinator can cross-reference the Event Manager roster, see this, and register that student automatically through Event Manager (this could also be done if a participant does not have internet access). Please let Jeff Souders know if you have an interest in this.

Another benefit of registering WITO participants through the PA WITO Event Manager Calendar is to provide participants continued access to PA hunting/trapping information through a free, one-year subscription to the PA Game Commission's magazine, Game News. Research shows that by keeping individuals engaged in the hunting culture in ways such as this, recruitment and retention is increased.

As you plan PA WITO events please help us capture the following information:

The following information should be included on flyers which will provide directions for participants on registering through

PGC's event manager:

"All participants must register for this event on the Pennsylvania Game Commissions (PGC) website: www.pgc.state.pa.us. On PGC's homepage, click on the "Education" tab. scroll down to "special events and programs" and click on "Women in the Outdoors." On the document that opens, click on "WITO Events Calendar" - find this event on the calendar and select it to continue with the registration process. Once your on-line registration is complete, please send your payment and class preferences to the event coordinator listed below."

List the PGC as a Women in the Outdoors sponsor through any press coverage including:

Please forward Jeff all flyers so that they can also be posted on PGC's site - this will provide additional advertising and has proven very successful. It is important that we encourage participants to register online. However, if a participant is adamant about foregoing this step, Jeff will manually enter the data. We do not want this to become an issue with our participants but we would like capture this data from the participant through this process, if possible.
